

## Using Google to Find Images for Reuse

Google has made a small change in the past month that can make a huge impact on how we teach students to use information/ graphics ethically. It is now much easier to search Google for images licenses for re-use.

1. Enter your search term in the box.
2. Click “Search Tools” to open a list of options.
3. Click “Usage Rights” to open a dropdown list.
4. Click the most suitable option for your purpose (likely “labeled for noncommercial reuse”).



You will find that searching this way will eliminate many of your results, but using those graphics that were not labeled for reuse constitutes fraud or plagiarism.

And remember—all graphics must still be cited!
